Competition Rules:	<p>The competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules of U.S. Figure Skating as set forth in the current 2009/2010 U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook except as specified in this announcement. Any changes at the May 2010 Governing Council that are declared urgent will be adhered to at this year's competition.</p> <p>Three entries in a single event constitute a competition. If an event has two or less entries, you will be notified of your options. All decisions of the Chief Referee will be final.</p> <p>Pairs are being re-introduced to our competition this year: however, we will require a minimum of four (4) pairs teams (any levels) to be entered before we will hold any pairs events.</p>		
US Figure Skating: Chief Referee:	Carla Golubski		
US Figure Skating Scoring:	<p>The ISU Judging System (IJS) will be used for Juvenile/Open Juvenile through Senior Level, Adult Gold, Adult Championship Gold, Adult Championship Jr/Sr, Adult Championship Int/Nov, and Juvenile through Senior Pairs. All other US Figure Skating events, including all Competitive Test Track Events, all Artistic events, all Basic Skills events, and Special Skater events will be judged under the 6.0 system. The closed system of judging will be used.</p> <p>All events qualified to be judged by the IJS judging system will require a Planned Element Form to be completed online with U.S. Figure Skating. Applications received without the Planned Element Form will be considered incomplete. An updated form will be accepted at the registration table prior to your events for use by the technical panel but will only be used at the discretion of the event controller.</p>		

US Figure Skating Groups:	<p>A skater may enter any event for which he/she is eligible, but only one event of each type. If more than 24 entries in any one class of a singles event, the skaters in that class shall be divided into groups of no more than twelve (12) skaters. Juvenile-Senior and adults will be divided by random draw and all others will be divided by age.</p> <p>Intermediate through Senior Singles and Novice through Senior Pairs Free Skating events will consist of the Short Program and the Free Skate Program as a combined event when skating in the Well-Balanced Free Skate Track. There is no Short Program in the Competitive Test Track.</p> <p>NO FINAL ROUNDS!!!!!!!!!!!!!!</p>
Admission:	There is no admission price for spectators. Children under the age of ten (10) must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
Eligibility:	<p>Skaters who are registered with US Figure Skating or who have a letter of permission from their Skating Federation are eligible to compete in Silver State Open Championship events.</p> <p>Test level standing is effective at close of entries. No "contingent" entries will be accepted. Tests required for eligibility in any event must be passed PRIOR to submission of entry. Any test(s) passed after the close of entries that adversely affects the eligibility requirements for the event entered, will disqualify the entrant and the entry fee will not be refunded, excluding any tests that are taken at Silver State Open Championships</p>
Basic Skills Eligibility:	<p>This competition is open to All skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Basic Skills Program and/or are full members of US Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete, but must be registered with the host Basic Skills program/club or any other Basic Skills program/club.</p> <p>Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All SNOWPLOW SAM and BASIC SKILLS SKATERS THROUGH BASIC 8 must skate at highest level passed and NO official US Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances.</p> <p>For the Free Skate 1-6, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (moves in the field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed or one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition.</p>
Special Skaters	The competition is open to all skaters who are full members of US Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries.

Artistic Events: The artistic event is open to all levels. Well Balanced Track and the Competitive Test Track will be combined in all Artistic events in all levels. This event is designed to portray a character or theme through music and costume. Vocal or instrumental music may be used. Costumes must be in good taste.

Skaters may select both Artistic Dramatic and Artistic Light Entertainment.

Groups or events may be combined if not enough entries in a category. Male and female skaters may be combined in Artistic events, but will be separated when a sufficient number of entrants permit.

Duet Events: Duets fall under the artistic category and are open to all levels of skaters. Duets may be composed of: male/female, female/female, or male/male. Create a program with another skater; perform like you are in an ice show and you want to entertain your audience. This is not a pair event, pair lifts are forbidden.

Skaters will compete at the highest free skating level of the pair or if a Basis Skills skater they will compete at the highest Snowplow Sam-Basic 8 or free skating level of the pair.

Groups or events may be combined if not enough entries in a category.

Interpretive Events: The interpretive event is open to all levels of skaters. This event is designed to provide a creative output for our participating skaters. The choreography for this program will be designed by each individual skater.

Groups may be combined if not enough entries in a level. Male and female skaters may be combined in Interpretive events, but will be separated when a sufficient number of entrants permit.

Pairs Events: The Pairs event is being re-introduced to the Silver State Open Championships and is open to pairs teams Pre-Juvenile-Senior: however, we will require a minimum of four (4) pairs teams (a combination of any levels) to be entered before we will hold any pairs events.

Registrar will notify skaters entering Pairs events ASAP to let them know if we will be holding the Pairs event due to number of entered teams.

Entry Forms: We have chosen to go to a secure online registration this year. You will be able to pay with a credit visit the Silver State page at www.lvskating.homestead.com and follow the link to Entryeeze. With the online registration, you will be charged a processing fee of 3.5% from Entryeeze. You will be charged this fee each time you make a purchase through Entryeeze. This processing fee is non-refundable.

We encourage use of the online system over mailed entries and checks; however we will continue to accept paper entries and checks, but they will be assessed an additional \$5.00 processing fee per event entered. This processing fee is non-refundable.

A Planned Element Form is required for Juvenile/Open Juvenile thru Senior Singles, Adult Championship Gold, Adult Championship Masters, and Pairs Juvenile-Senior. This may be completed online with U.S. Figure Skating.

For all age restricted events, age as of the entry deadline will govern.

Entries **will not** be accepted by telephone or fax.

Entry Fees: *First Basic Skills Event or Special Skater Event* \$70.00
All U.S. Figure Skating Singles Events Adults, Well Balanced, Test Track, Artistic (Short Program & Free Skate Program are one event) \$110.00
Pairs Event per skater (Short Program & Free Skate Program are one event) **May not be taken as your first event unless it is the only event you are entering** \$65.00
Duet Event per skater **May not be taken as your first event unless it is the only event you are entering** \$60.00
All Additional Events \$45.00

If you mail entry to registrar please enclose an additional processing fee of \$5.00 per event entered. With online entry through Entryeeze you will be charged a processing fee of 3.5% each time you make a purchase. Processing fees are non-refundable.

Late Entries: Entries postmarked after July 6, 2010 will be accepted only at the discretion of the referee and the competition committee and will incur a \$30.00 late fee.

Cancellations and Refunds: Once entries have closed, entry fees are refundable only if the competition is not held per U.S. Figure Skating rule #3235. If there are not enough entries to hold an event and time allows, the referee may offer an exhibition or critique (IJS sheets) in lieu of a refund for that event. The Processing fee portion of the fees is non-refundable.

Returned checks: A \$30.00 fee will be payable to the Las Vegas FSC for any returned checks. In addition, the skater will not be permitted to skate until the appropriate fees have been paid (CASH OR MONEY ORDER ONLY), including the \$30.00 returned check fee. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS!!

Practice Ice: All practice ice sessions will be 30 minutes in length. Skaters will be able to pick their own practice ice sessions online, but you must indicate number of sessions you want on the practice ice form or online when you register and you must pay for them with your entry form or when you register online. You will receive an email with a PIN number in order to access your practice ice records and select your sessions.

If you pre-order online, the cost is \$15.00 per session. If you mail in your practice ice, the cost is \$15.00 plus a \$3.00 processing fee for a total of \$18.00. Once skaters that have pre-ordered have had the chance to go online and pick their sessions, additional practice ice sales will be available online at the cost of \$18.00 per session.

Additional practice ice will be available for purchase on site starting Thursday, August 12 at the cost of \$18.00. Music will be played on these sessions only. Music will be played by draw. Music draw will take place on a "first come, first served basis" 30 minutes prior to the start of each session. There is no guarantee that your music will be played, however every effort will be made to do so.

Each competitor may purchase ONE SESSION for each event entered for DAY OF COMPETITION PRACTICE ICE only at this time. If your skating level allows a short and a long program, you may only purchase one session each for short and long for a total of two sessions.

NO MUSIC WILL BE PLAYED ON "DAY OF COMPETITION PRACTICE ICE!!"

Practice ice sessions are non-refundable and non-transferable.

Competition Schedule: It is left to the discretion of the Chief Referee as to order, time, and day of each event. Skaters should be prepared to skate at any time that their event may be scheduled. A **tentative** schedule will be available on the Las Vegas Figure Skating Club's website www.lvskating.homestead.com and at www.entryeeze.com as soon as it is available.

- Official Schedule:** The official schedule will be posted in the rink lobby during the event. All changes to the schedule will be noted on the posted official schedule and will serve as due notice. Please check the official schedule frequently during the competition.
- Check In:** A registration desk will be established in the rink. All competitors are requested to register as soon as possible upon arrival at the ice arena (no later than 60 minutes before your 1st scheduled event). Events may begin as much as 20 minutes before the scheduled starting time at the Chief Referee's discretion. Skaters must check in with the Ice Monitor 30 minutes before they are scheduled to skate.
- Music:** CD's ONLY!!!!!!!!!!!!!! CD's must be plainly marked with name and event.
- No CD-RW accepted. Single track CD's only; no more than one program per CD.
- CD's must be turned in at the Registration Desk at least 45 minutes prior to competing. CD's will not be accepted any earlier than one (1) hour before your event.
- We will not accept any responsibility for breakage or damage; however, every precaution will be used to safeguard music. Have a back-up copy available rink-side in the event that there is a problem with the first CD.
- After the event, competitors must pick up their music at the Registration Desk. Las Vegas FSC will not return any music by mail.
- Awards:** Desert Flowers I/Cactus Pete I thru Pre-Preliminary in the Well Balanced Free Skate Track and Limited Beginner thru Pre-Preliminary in the Competitive Test Track will have trophies for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place. All other levels and events will receive medals for 1st thru 4th place, with Basic Skills and Special Skaters below 4th place receiving a participation ribbon.
- Perpetual Awards:** Three trophies will be awarded:
- The Dena Darland Award This perpetual trophy will be awarded to the winner or winners of the Intermediate Ladies Well Balanced FREE SKATING Event. Dena Darland won the 1993 US Nationals Intermediate Ladies Event representing the Las Vegas FSC. This trophy is being donated in her honor. The perpetual trophy, with the winner's name engraved, will have a permanent home with the Las Vegas FSC. A smaller personal trophy representing this award will be presented to the winner.
- The Casey Link Award This perpetual trophy will be awarded to the winner or winners of the Novice Ladies Well Balanced FREE SKATING Event. Casey Link won the 1989 US Nationals Novice Ladies Event representing the Las Vegas FSC. This trophy is being donated in her honor. The perpetual trophy, with the winner's name engraved, will have a permanent home with the Las Vegas FSC. A smaller personal trophy representing this award will be presented to the winner.
- The Zack Sidhu Award This perpetual trophy will be awarded to the best male skater Novice or below in any event. Zack Sidhu was named to the Jr Grand Prix Team of 2009 representing the Las Vegas FSC in Pairs. This trophy is being donated in his honor. The perpetual trophy, with the winner's name engraved, will have a permanent home with the Las Vegas FSC. A smaller personal trophy representing this award will be presented to the winner.
- Photos:** Pictures of the top four skaters in each event will be taken on the podium following the posting of results. All skaters can also purchase individual pictures. Action photos of each skater will also be available.

IF YOU ARE OBSERVED DOING THIS YOU WILL BE ASKED TO DELETE WHAT YOU HAVE TAPED.** This rule will be enforced. Please have your taped cued and ready to record or a new tape may be purchased from the video crew at the competition. You must notify the video crew that your skater would like to be recorded BEFORE you skate.
- Administration: **Result sheets of non IJS events will be available for** (25¢ each) at the Registration desk. For IJS events the individual protocol sheet will be free and prices will be posted at the competition for IJS packets.

The 6.0 judging system will be used. Skaters may choose to participate in either the Test Track or Well-Balanced Free Skating Track, but not both during the same non-qualifying competition. Deductions will be taken if skaters include technical elements that are not permitted in the event. No final rounds for Test Track events. Vocal music permitted. Skaters must be 20 years of age or younger by close of entries. All program times are ±10 seconds.

ARTISTIC Combined Events

The Artistic Program is one in which the skating moves are selected for their value in enhancing the skater's artistry and interpretation of the music rather than for technical difficulty. The presentation should include style, originality, and expression of the music. The program should be an integrated exploration of the music: with emphasis being placed on skating skills, transitions, performance, choreography, and interpretation. Composition of the program should conform the choreography with music and utilization of ice surface in a harmonious composition of the program as a whole. Vocal music is permitted. Costumes must be in good taste. **Hand held props only, no on ice props allowed.** All requirements and restrictions that apply to the groups in the Free Skating events, with respect to allowable jumps and spins, apply to the same level of the Artistic events. Somersault jumps where the skater actually leaves the ice and flips in the air are not permitted. Acrobatic moves such as somersaults on the ice, cartwheels, and other similar moves are permitted. Skaters may select **both** Artistic Dramatic and Artistic Light entertainment. Skate time durations adhere to National Showcase requirements.

DUET Events

The Duet Program is designed to entertain the audience. The skating moves are selected for their value in producing a "show" program. The program should play to the audience. Vocal music is permitted. Costumes must be in good taste. **Hand held props only, no on ice props allowed.** All requirements and restrictions that apply to the groups in the Free Skating events, with respect to allowable jumps and spins, apply to the same level of the Duet events. Somersault jumps where the skater actually leaves the ice and flips in the air are not permitted. Acrobatic moves such as somersaults on the ice, cartwheels, and other similar moves are permitted. Groups or events may be combined if not enough entries in a category. Skate time durations adhere to National Showcase requirements. Skaters must skate at the level of the highest test level of the pair.

INTERPRETIVE Events

The Interpretive Program is designed to provide a creative output for our participating skaters. The choreography for this program will be designed by each individual skater. There is no instruction allowed during this event from coaches, parents, or fellow skaters. Staging area must be kept clear except for ice monitor and listening competitor. The technical difficulty will be considered in the judge's marks, but entertainment value utilizing skating moves, originality, and music interpretation/expression will also be considered. All requirements and restrictions that apply to the groups in the Free Skating events, with respect to allowable jumps and spins, apply to the same level of the Interpretive events. Music will be approximately 1:30.

The skaters will be given 5 minutes of warm up time on the ice and the music will be played twice during each warm up session. Following the warm up, all skaters except for the first skater will be escorted to a soundproof area of the arena. The first skater will hear the music one more time and then perform a program to the music. As each skater performs, the next skater in line will be allowed to hear the music for a third time before they perform to the music. The listening skater will not be allowed to view the Performing skater.
